What was the 19th century equivalent of the 'Ten Pound Pom' - the 'assisted immigrant'. For most of the century it was the 'assisted passage' that attracted emigrants from the British Isles and Ireland to this distant continent, making the colonies competitive with the much cheaper fares to the USA and Canada. Virtually half of all immigrant arrivals between 1830 and 1900 came 'assisted' and but for the gold rush of the 1850s that proportion would have been much higher. Japanese War Criminal Trial held in Darwin in 1946

Many people are aware of the Japanese war criminal trials that were held in various locations in the South-West Pacific following Japan's surrender and the cessation of hostilities in World War Two (WW2) in September 1945. What a lot of people don't know is the fact that there were war criminal trials held in Darwin in 1946. The trials, three in all and all based on separate charges, were held in the Officer's Mess at Larrakeyah Army Barracks Darwin in March and April 1946. The trials addressed charges of war criminal activities perpetrated by nineteen former Imperial Japanese Army members ranging from Privates to Colonel rank. In all there were twenty-one charges laid with several of the accused being tried on two separate charges. The three trials covered war crimes perpetrated on Australian and British troops on the island of Timor between 1943 and 1945 with charges ranging from torture and ill treatment to that of murder. The small French village of Vignacourt was always behind the front lines. For much of the First World War it was a staging point, casualty clearing station and recreation area for troops of all nationalities moving up to and then back from the battlefields on the Somme.
